- Red Angus membership survey a year ago. Several things came out that they need to work on, not many details at the moment.
- RedsPro functioning since fall 2017, 80% of registrations are done on Reds Pro
- Paper still is two day turn around right now.
- DNA submissions continue to grow 13% year to date this year
- Financial stand point has never been stronger, debt free right now.
- Buckle & Banner is a new publication for the show ring.
- 100,000 active cows in the Red Angus Breed right now
- 4th Largest Breed Overall in registrations
- Red Angus commercial female is the most preferred female in the industry
- \$250,000 spent on national advertising

Candidate Introduction:

- Each candidate running for election was introduced & spoke.
- No nominations from the Floor.
- Members will vote on a paper ballot. Ray Paslawski & Steven Rogers will collect votes and count them.

Kent McClary from Tyson Foods Guest Speaker while votes are calculated:

- Each week harvest 135,000 head of cattle
- 6 beef slaughtering facilities in the US
- 85% Choice, 10% Prime, 30% CAB, 15-16% Fats
- Industry wide having the best grading they've ever had
- Verifed Red Angus Grid
 - Gives you an option to retain ownership, to fatten your cattle and send them to Tyson. You can feed your cattle and they will send a buyer to look at them or you can forward contract them to Tyson.
 - \circ Base price is based off of a 5 area weighted average each week.
 - Last week was \$204.91, if grade less than 65% choice then deduct \$1.00 65-73% get weighted average 85% Choice + \$2 above
 - \$15 on every prime, upper 2/3 choice \$4
 - Stand 15% of dark cutters, over weight carcass, etc
 - \circ $\,$ Must have FCCP verified tag $\,$
- BQA-must have current BQA certificate before they can come bid your cattle.
 - Trucker must be BQA certified as well.
- ARA now offers the E-ID tags with the FCCP tags
- Tyson is having trouble reading some E-ID tags
- They don't think that plant based protein will replace beef, but could go into countries that cannot afford, beef, pork or chicken.
