


How the Red Color Works

B= dominant black gene BB= homozygous black b= recessive red gene Bb= heterozygous black, red carrier




100% of progeny will be red (even if any red parent had a black parent)

Black, Red-Carrier x Red




50% of progeny will be black. Reds will be pure red & blacks will be all black red-carriers.

Homozygous Black x Red



100% of progeny will be black, red carriers.

Black, Red-Carrier x Black, Red-Carrier



75% of the progeny will be black & 25% will be red. Of the blacks, 2/3 (50% of the total progeny) will be red carriers & 1/3 (25% of total progeny) will be non-red carriers.

Note; A red calf, even if from black parents, is pure red (bb). It has NO black genes.

The red color of Red Angus has three distinct advantages:

- Red is the most populous color of cattle breeds world wide. Red Angus provides a continuity and uniformity of color to any crossbreeding system.
- 2) Red is more heat tolerant than black and the bronze pigmentation gives a great resistance to cancer eye and sun burned udders. The majority of the world's cattle are in areas that need heat tolerance, so the red color is a definite advantage.
- 3) Red crossed red always breeds true. Red Angus carry no diluter genes and thus avoids the grays that result when crossbreeding with blacks.



Why Missouri Red Angus?

An old cattleman saying is...

"You can move cattle North & West, but you can't move cattle South & East."

Many of us have experienced the problems that can be associated with importing newly purchased cattle into our environment. What we've seen is a significant percentage of cattle that have not been raised on fescue who will struggle once imported into the fescue belt and forced to perform in our environment "on the grass we love to hate". Cattle experiencing fescue toxicosis, also referred to as "summer slump", may exhibit rough hair coats, heat stress, suppressed appetite, poor growth and reduced calving rates. Some animals eventually overcome this issue, but many will not and will eventually be culled from the herd.

While there are several tools offered to combat the problems such as mineral supplements, DNA testing, etc., their success rate is limited at best. The USDA estimates that fescue toxicosis costs the U.S. beef industry an estimated \$600 million to \$1 billion annually in lost revenue because of reduced reproductive and growth rates in cattle herds.

Research on the subject has been done for years. In 2016, University of Missouri Extension geneticist, Dr. Jared Decker, won a \$2 million grant from the USDA to find genetic differences among regions. Decker and his colleagues are utilizing DNA markers to study the interactions between cattle DNA and the environment. The study is focused on DNA, hair shedding and tall fescue forage. When complete, the data will used to design region-specific EPD's.







Separating Sire Selection

for Maternal and Terminal Traits

Sire selection, whether selecting AI sires or buying bulls, is a genetic decision that undoubtedly affects profitability and the long-term success of an operation. Of course, every operation has different goals and selection criteria. Still, it is undeniable that a bull's influence on a large subset of the calf crop each year makes these decisions economically significant. Many considerations go into sire selection with the foundation being breed type, pedigree, phenotype, and genetics. It's not uncommon for us, as producers, to use bulls with "balanced genetic profiles" that theoretically can produce both replacement heifers and market-targeted calves. However, this method of sire selection reduces selection intensity for desired traits. By selecting a sire that is "good enough" for both maternal and terminal traits, are we leaving performance on the table in both categories? One underused management approach is to separate sire selection for the production of maternal versus terminal progeny.

Replacement Heifers

Artificial insemination (AI) is a technology that can be used to effectively incorporate this management method into a system. Al provides a way to incorporate superior genetics into the herd without the need to invest in high-cost sires. Al sires often have greater genetic and phenotypic merit, along with improved EPD accuracy compared to what is available locally. When used to produce replacement heifer candidates, genetic merit for relevant maternal traits in those Al-sired females can be greatly improved. Also, with increased accuracy, there are more records to back the EPD profile of the bull, meaning we can be more confident in the reliability of their numbers. Paired with estrus synchronization, AI provides the opportunity to front-load the calving season, increasing the proportion of potential replacement heifers born early in the calving season. By giving those replacement heifer candidates an age advantage, we increase the likelihood the heifers will conceive early in their first breeding season, which has implications for their long-term success in the cow herd and the calves produced by that female.

Terminal Sire Selection

Using AI to produce maternally-oriented calves as replacement heifer candidates creates another opportunity: we can now select natural service sires with different criteria and a terminal focus. By eliminating the need to select a bull that carries both maternal and terminal traits, an operation can increase selection intensity for terminal traits and improve performance in calves they plan to sell at weaning or retain ownership on. This can improve calf performance in areas such as growth and carcass, along with improving calf uniformity. Optimizing terminal traits in the calf crop can increase their value in the marketplace.

Crossbreeding can also be an effective tool in this instance. When an operation is raising replacement females and marketing terminally-focused calves, selecting females that excel maternally to produce replacement heifers and breeding the remaining cows to a terminal sire of a different breed will increase individual heterosis of those progeny. Paired with thoughtful genetic selection decisions, these advantages can directly impact profitability within a herd.

Sexed Semen


Admittedly, in management systems that use bulls with maternally oriented genetics to produce replacement heifer candidates, there will still be steer calves sired by the maternally-focused AI bull. One way to increase the ratio of female to male calf progeny out of the AI sire is by using sexed semen. Sex-sorted semen can be used to increase the likelihood that an AI-sired calf will be of a certain sex. Although not every bull is available with sexed semen, this system could be used to increase the number of AI-sired calves that are heifers. The sorting process used to produce sexed semen can result in somewhat reduced conception rates compared with conventional semen, as well as an increased cost per straw. For best results with sexed semen, use estrus detection aids and/or monitor heat activity, and only use sexed semen on those females that have expressed estrus by the time of AI.

Summary

Separating sire selection for maternal and terminal traits will help optimize trait-based performance in the cow herd and in market-targeted calves. Selection intensity for each of the sire groups will be improved because fewer compromises are made in selection intensity for desired traits. This allows for targeted breeding decisions that can directly affect profitability.

PHILLY BEEF CHEESESTEAK SANDWICHES

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 beef Top Sirloin Steak Boneless, 3/4 inch thick (about 1 pound)
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 teaspoons olive oil, divided
- 1 medium onion, thinly sliced (about 2 cups)
- 1 medium green bell pepper, thinly sliced (about 2 cups)
- 4 whole-grain or whole wheat hoagie rolls, split, toasted
- 6 thin slices reduced-fat provolone cheese

Cook's Tip: To grill, keep steak whole and season with garlic powder and pepper as directed in step 1. Place steak on grid over medium, ash-covered coals. Grill, covered, 7 to 11 minutes (over medium heat on preheated gas grill, 8 to 13 minutes) for medium rare (145°F) to medium (160°F) doneness, turning once.



COOKING:

- Cut beef Top Sirloin Steak lengthwise in half, then crosswise into 1/8-inch thick strips.
 Season beef with garlic powder and pepper. Set aside.
- Heat 1 teaspoon oil in large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add onion and pepper; stir-fry 30 seconds to 1 minute. Remove from skillet; keep warm.

Cook's Tip: In some classic Philly Beef Cheese Steak Sandwiches, you'll find the addition of sautéed sliced mustrooms. You may add 8 ounces of sliced mustrooms and stir-fry with onion and pepper.

- Heat 1/2 teaspoon oil in same skillet until hot. Add half of beef; stir-fry 2 to 3 minutes or until outside surface of beef is no longer pink. Remove from skillet; keep warm. Repeat with remaining 1/2 teaspoon oil and remaining beef.
- 4. Return beef and vegetables to skillet; cook and stir until heated through. Season with salt and pepper, as desired. Top beef with cheese slices. Heat, covered, 1 to 2 minutes or until cheese is melted; stir gently to mix. Place beef mixture on bottom half of rolls. Close sandwiches.

Cook's Tip: The sandwiches can be topped with chopped tomatoes, if desired. You may substitute your favorite prepared cheese sauce for provotone cheese. The sautéed bell pepper may be served on top of the beef instead of mixed with the beef. You may broif sandwiches filled with beef and vegetable mixture, topped with cheese slices for 2 minutes on HIGH or until cheese is melted and begins to brown.





CLASSIC BEEF PATTY MELT

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 pound Ground Beef (93% lean or leaner)
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 cup diced onion
- 4 slices rye bread, cut diagonally in half
- 4 slices American cheese
- 4 slices thinly sliced Swiss cheese

Cook's Tip: Cooking times are for fresh or thoroughly thawed ground beef. Ground beef should be cooked to an internal temperature of 160°F. Color is not a reliable indicator of ground beef doneness.

Cook's Tip: All sandwiches may be toasted at the same time using larger skillet or griddle.

COOKING:

- Heat heavy large cast iron or non-stick skillet or griddle on medium heat.
 Meanwhile, combine ground beef, Worcestershire sauce, pepper and salt in medium bowl, mixing lightly but thoroughly. Lightly shape into four 1/2-inch thick patties.
- Place patties in skillet; cook 10 to 12 minutes until instant-read thermometer inserted horizontally into center of patty registers 160°F for medium doneness, turning occasionally. Remove from skillet; keep warm.
- Melt 1 tablespoon butter in same skillet. Add onion; cook 6 to 8 minutes or until golden brown and very tender, stirring often. Remove onions from skillet; keep warm.
- 4. Spread remaining 1 tablespoon butter on one side of each bread slice half. Place 2 bread halves, buttered-side down in skillet. Layer each with 1 slice American cheese, 1 burger and 1 slice Swiss cheese; quarter of onion mixture, top with bread slices, buttered-side up. Weight down sandwiches with heavy pan; cook 1 to 3 minutes on each side or until bread is golden brown, turning sandwiches once. Repeat with remaining bread, burgers and cheeses.


